REQUIREMENT TO NOTIFY OF PRIVATE FOSTERING ARRANGEMENTS

Private fostering describes a situation where a parent makes arrangements for their child under 16 (or 18 if the child has a disability) to live with an adult who is not related to them to provide day-to-day care on their behalf for 28 days or more.

It is a legal requirement¹ to report such arrangements to the local authority as children's services have a duty to assess the child's wellbeing and ensure that carers are suitably supported to provide care.

Examples might include: a teenager living with the family of a boyfriend or girlfriend; a child living with a family friend due to problems at home; a child living with a sponsor in the UK for education or health care and the parents are overseas; or where a parent leaves their child with a friend as they cannot provide consistent care because of difficult circumstances such as illness, unsociable work hours or financial difficulties.

Note that private fostering does not apply if the person is a grandparent, step-parent, uncle or aunt, sibling, half-relative or step-relative. It also does not apply if the child is a child looked after and in the care of a foster carer.
