Subject: English

Intent

- It is our intent that pupils with special educational needs/disabilities (SEN/D) follow the same curriculum, learn alongside their peers and achieve similar outcomes.
- In addition, they may benefit from additional opportunities in the lessons and in the cocurricular activities that are arranged especially for them.

Implementation

As a result of extensive in-house training we are confident that all teachers are effective teachers of pupils with SEN/D and that pupils should be withdrawn from mainstream lessons only when there is a clear rationale for doing so and all relevant stakeholders have been fully consulted.

Consequently, within our subject area, pupils with SEN/D may be:

- sensitively positioned on the seating plan
- working with different resources
- accessing word processors when writing extended pieces
- working on different activities in lessons
- and/or receive support from additional adults in the classroom
- working with different access arrangements e.g. movement breaks

Impact

Impact is demonstrated across our subject area in the following ways:

- The subject specific knowledge and skills which students retain in their long-term memories:
 - retrieval practice of key quotes for Literature texts
 - students have strategies for comprehension and analysis of texts
 - students have strategies for extended writing tasks
- The academic outcomes students achieve:
 - 3-year data shows high percentage of students attain grade 4 and above for English Language and Literature at GCSE.

- Functional Skills course in Y11: 12 of 15 students passed Level 2 last year.
- Pupils are ready for the next stage of their education i.e. the destinations students reach post 16 and post 18:
 - A high percentage of students attain grade 4 and above for English Language and Literature at GCSE.
 - Work related skills are taught at each Key Stage e.g. letter writing.
 - There is a good uptake at A-Level, particularly in Literature and Film Studies.
- Skills developed via co-curricular/enrichment activities on offer by the department:
 - Creative Writing Club a number of students' writing has recently been published.
 - Students have the opportunity to enter creative writing competitions.
 - Students are encouraged to participate in reading challenges e.g. Accelerated Reader program, Readathon and reading quizzes.
 - All students have access to the library and reading lists and have opportunities to engage with reading activities e.g. author visits.
- A passion for the subject and for learning is instilled in pupils:
 - Students show engagement in lessons and activities like creative writing club and we have a good uptake of our subjects at A-Level.
