Students are assessed through an emotional literacy checklist at the beginning and end of the year (selfassessment). Pupils will also complete a personal 'check-in' each lesson using an 'emotional thermometer'. Teachers will use these measures and their observations to assess how far students are meeting lesson objectives and personal targets.
