Curriculum Intent

In Year 13 students continue to study the WJEC Eduqas Religious Studies course aimed at developing their critical thinking and communication skills. They examine core Islamic beliefs, teachings and practices from the perspective of both Sunni and Shi'a Islam and critically assess philosophical and ethical perspectives surrounding Free Will, Determinism and Meta-ethics as well as religious experiences and religious language. Students will explain, examine, compare and evaluate scholarly and religious views and continue to develop tolerance, respect for others, as well as a sense of belonging within a diverse British society in order for them to identify and develop their own beliefs. Students will continue to develop academic study habits necessary for success at higher education.

Component 3: Religion and Ethics	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> -Ethical thought, including meta-ethical approaches such as Naturalism, Intuitionism and Emotivism. -The normative ethical theory of Situation Ethics. -Free Will and Determinism, including religious, philosophical and scientific approaches with scholarly support and challenge.
