
This means that the employers work with the universities to create a bespoke degree programme which leads to a degree but is tailored to meet the specific academic and vocational needs of that particular employer

recruitment of degree apprentices is being managed by the employers' HR and recruitment teams, in the same way that a job application would be handled.





- Universities and colleges can easily find information to make selection decisions and target support.

PREDICTED GRADES

- The three sections will help universities decide how to support applications





Section 2 - Enter any information about extenuating circumstances which may affect this applicant's performance in examinations or other assessments (optional)

Include relevant information that contextualises the grades (achieved or predicted), for example:


- individual circumstances e.g., mature student, disability, serious, acute, or chronic illness, bereavement, significant adverse personal circumstances (with applicant consent) where this has had led to a mismatch match between student potential and achieved or predicted grades
- **context** as to why there is a disparity between an individual's grades achieved throughout the school or college (e.g. at GCSE/ Scottish national 4/5 equivalent and predicted grades, where applicable)

Include relevant information that **contextualises the impact** of specific circumstances and the measures put in place, for example:
