# **Water Safety**

With the temperatures rising, a national and local current safeguarding concern is young people and water safety. In the UK, there were 277 deaths from accidental drowning in 2021 from inland and coastal locations. Forty percent of people who lost their lives had no intention of entering the water, with slips, trips and falls being the main cause of them entering the water. The Royal Berkshire Fire and Rescue Service are coming into visit the Year 7s for an assembly in the last weeks of term and they have asked us to share the following guidance:

- 88% believe being able or good at something is valued and celebrated.
