

1. THE HUNGER GAMES (2012)

The hunger games is an action-packed, explosive dystopian film based off the book of the same name (author: Suzanne Collins). It is set in a version of the earth where terrible events have occurred, but some of humanity have managed to survive and build an empire on a country named Panem which is divided into multiple districts. The movie follows a girl named Katniss Everdeen, who is chosen to participate in the yearly Hunger games- a competition held by the capital where tributes from all districts fight to the death. This is a movie perfect for fans of the book and it is full of exciting, tension-filled battel scenes. You can find it on Netflix and amazon prime.

2. HAUNTED MANSION (2023)

Haunted mansion is a 'supernatural horror' about a single mum, Gabbie, who hires a tour guide, a physic, a priest and a historian to help exorcise her newly bought mansion after discovering it is inhabited by a plethora of ghosts. This is a fun and lighthearted comedy with quite a few good scares throughout. The characters (and ghosts) are funny and likeable, making it an entertaining watch. I would recommend it for young horror fans or people that scare easily but would like a good Halloween movie. It was definitely a well-balanced mix of horror and family fun and worth a watch any time of the yearyou can find it on Disney+.



3. A HAUNTING IN VENICE (2023)

This one's for fans of a good murder mystery. In post-World War II Venice, Poirot, a retired detective, reluctantly attends a seance. But when one of the guests is murdered, it is up to him to uncover the killer. The film is loosely based on the 1969 Agatha christie novel Halloween, containing some of the same characters. It is an exciting, dark and thrilling mystery, with mysterious characters and a pretty backdrop of moonlit Venice. Like every classic Poirot movie, it is full of twists and turns and will leave you on the edge of your seat.

4. A BALLAD OF SONGS AND SNAKES (2023)


Another instalment in the hunger games world, this movie is the prequel to the original trilogy. It follows the tyrannical president snow when he is a mere teenager and has to mentor his own district 12 tribute in the 10 th hunger games. Much to my delight the movie follows the book very faithfully and is full of brutal kills and action which made the book so great. Spanning almost 3 hours, the movie covers about a year of snow's life as he slowly begins to develop into the cold-hearted murderer that he is in the original series. You also meet the family and friends of snow, the ones that begin to influence his lifestyle and mind in twisted ways. It is an absolutely brutal, incredible and sometimes truly chilling movie that will leave you tense and reeling. Definitely a must-watch for fans of the books and movies. 
