Mentoring a younger sibling and helping them with their schoolwork or homework.	Family friend/neighbour, siblings teacher
Coaching a sibling or another family member to learn an instrument or develop another skill.	Family friend/neighbour, music teacher, DofE Leader
Volunteering with St John Ambulance – 12 week fundraising plan	DofE leader, tutor,
